The Smart Growth Network developed a set of ten basic principles:

- 1. Mix land uses
- 2. Take advantage of compact building design
- 3. Create a range of housing opportunities and choices
- 4. Create walkable neighborhoods
- 5. Foster distinctive, attractive communities with a strong sense of place
- Preserve open space, farmland, natural beauty, and critical environmental areas
- 7. Strengthen and direct development towards existing communities
- 8. Provide a variety of transportation choices
- Make development decisions predictable, fair, and cost effective
- 10.Encourage community and stakeholder collaboration in development decisions

Guiding Principles

- Communities will provide a range of housing types and affordability so people of all income levels can live in the same community.
- Communities will have clear boundaries and be separated from one another by working landscapes, greenbelts, or parks.
- Communities will have distinct centers where shopping, medical services, childcare, schools, jobs, and infrastructure are available.
- Open space, wildlife habitat, scenic vistas, agricultural lands, forests, rivers, and lakes will be protected and maintained for wildlife habitat, productive grazing and agricultural lands, and recreation.
- Development will not outpace the ability of County government to provide adequate services and infrastructure or reduce the level of service provided to existing communities.
- Highways and streets will be well-maintained and well-connected.
 Public transit and bike and pedestrian facilities will provide choices for travel within communities and to major destinations.
- Government services will be efficient and effective with measurable results.
- Through community involvement and volunteerism, residents will be active participants in guiding Calaveras County towards a common vision for the future.

Property Rights Principles

- Protects the rights of property owners to use their property as he or she wishes, without harming the rights of the neighbors or the public.
- Promotes market based solutions to today's and tomorrow's problems.
- Promotes a stable environment for business planning.
- Development would be market driven, not plan driven. The current market would determine what the current market wants and needs.
- Infrastructure would be the responsibility of the property owner as it should be. The owner would collaborate with infrastructure providers as they do now. Problems with ground water depletion would be solved primarily by the property owner.
- Promotes simplifying and streamlining the regulations, fees, and procedures for development.



"Land...cannot be treated as an ordinary asset, controlled by individuals and subject to the pressures and inefficiencies of the market. Private land ownership is also a principal instrument of accumulation and concentration of wealth and therefore contributes to social injustice; if unchecked, it may become a major obstacle in the planning and implementation of development schemes. Public control of land use is therefore indispensable...."
