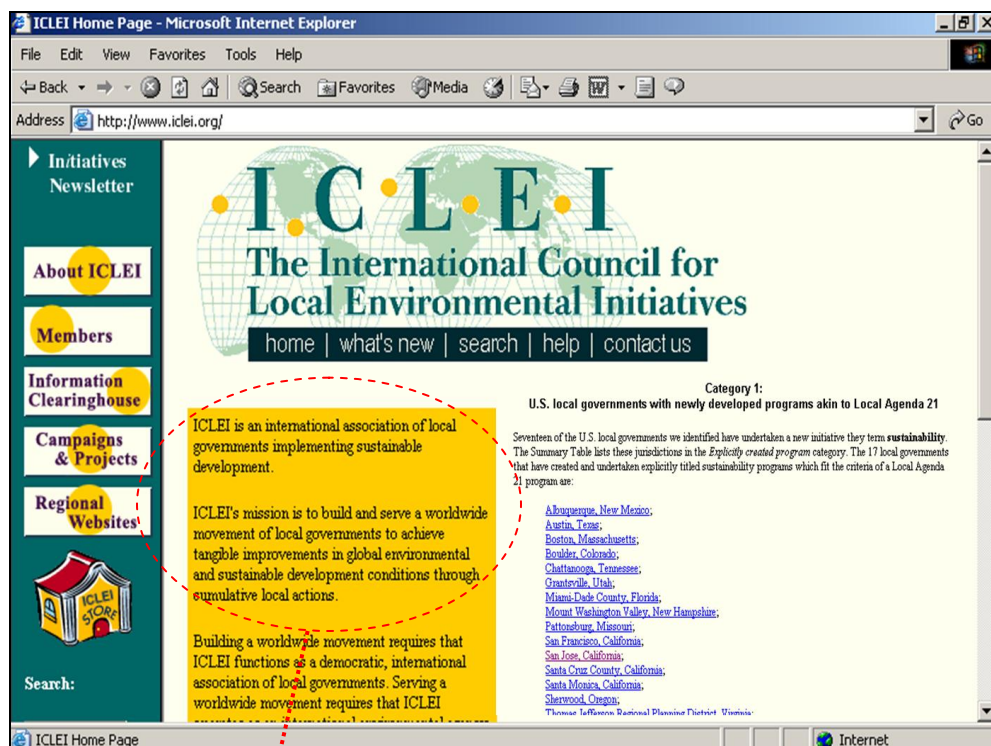

The full name of ICLEI is “The International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives”. It is also called “Local Governments for Sustainability”.

ICLEI is an important NGO that:

- Closely ties policy to man-made Global Warming and climate change.
- Has formed an international Congress filled with city and county representatives. This Congress acts as a shadow World Government.
- Directs Community Planning Development and other local agencies and provides statutory and regulatory provisions that implement Sustainable policy locally.

Local tax funds pay the contract fee. Agenda 21 policy-making is fully embedded upon ICLEI’s arrival. At least 600 cities, including Bloomberg led New York City, from all across the nation, have ICLEI contracts. Local governments have been hijacked by world government agents.

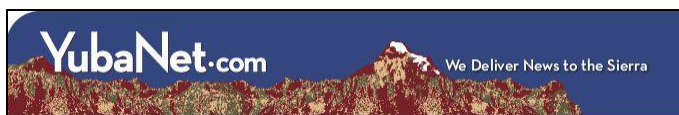

Key Findings (sample)


- ...**while climate change is not seen as a pressing issue**, many of the challenges these communities reported facing are directly to indirectly related to climate change. For example, many participants mentioned that **managing water supplies**, **reducing energy consumption**, building more efficient transportation systems, and **protecting open space** were all issues seen as significant local challenges.
- ...many commented that addressing climate change was more of a secondary benefit of pursuing “good planning” decisions – including reducing vehicle miles traveled, encouraging denser development, and reducing energy and water consumption. However, some noted that addressing climate change has been a new and helpful justification for adopting some of these “good planning” principles that have faced **opposition** in the past.
- ...the most common way of framing policies that impact climate change appears to be “**sustainability**.” Other communities intentionally avoid any environmental references and frame their policy proposals in terms of “**economic efficiency**”...

Steve Frisch, Executive Director of the Sierra Business Council, will focus his remarks on demographic challenges and the need for smart growth in the foothills. He will also review the three kinds of capital -- social, financial and natural.

Charles Field, Executive Director of the Amador County Transportation Commission, will talk about his work in coordinating a multi-county "BLUEPRINT," a process of integrating transportation, land use and housing planning.

Patrick Lucey, Senior Aquatic Ecologist with Aqua-Tex Scientific Consulting Ltd, will come from Canada to talk about watershed sensitive urban planning, design and implementation. Lucey is collaborating with Governor Schwarzenegger's Administration on California's watershed issues.

Steve Welinsky, Chair and District 2 supervisor of the Calaveras County Board of Supervisors, will speak on moving forward to build a viable community and how to bring sometimes opposing factions together for common goals.

Other experts will participate in panel discussions on smart growth including preservation of ag land, watershed protection, green building, workforce housing and the arts. Many local government officials are participating and speaking.

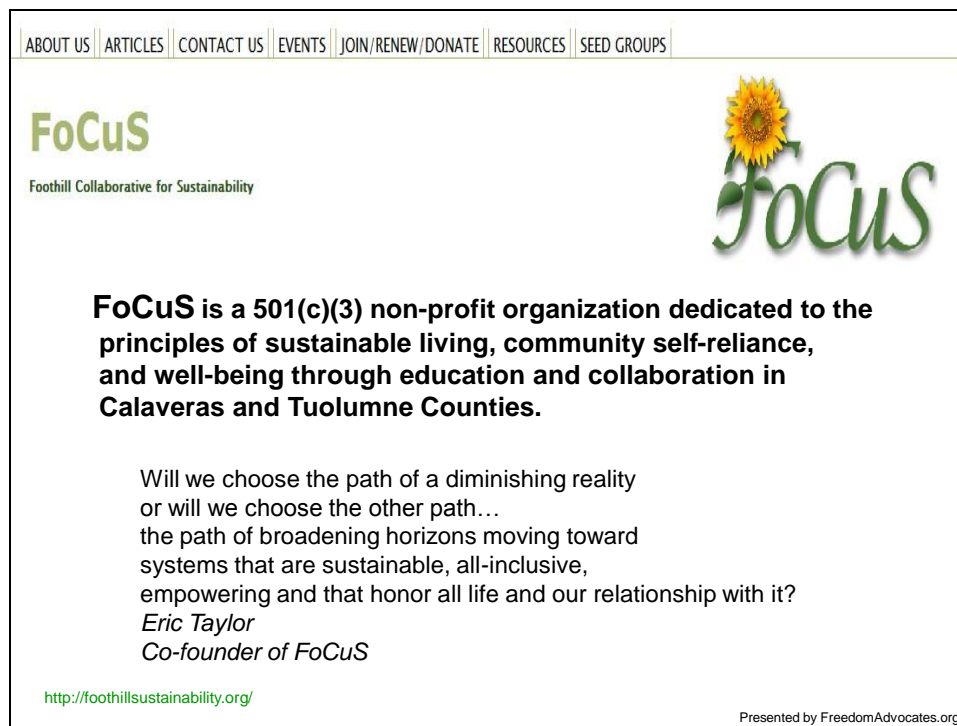

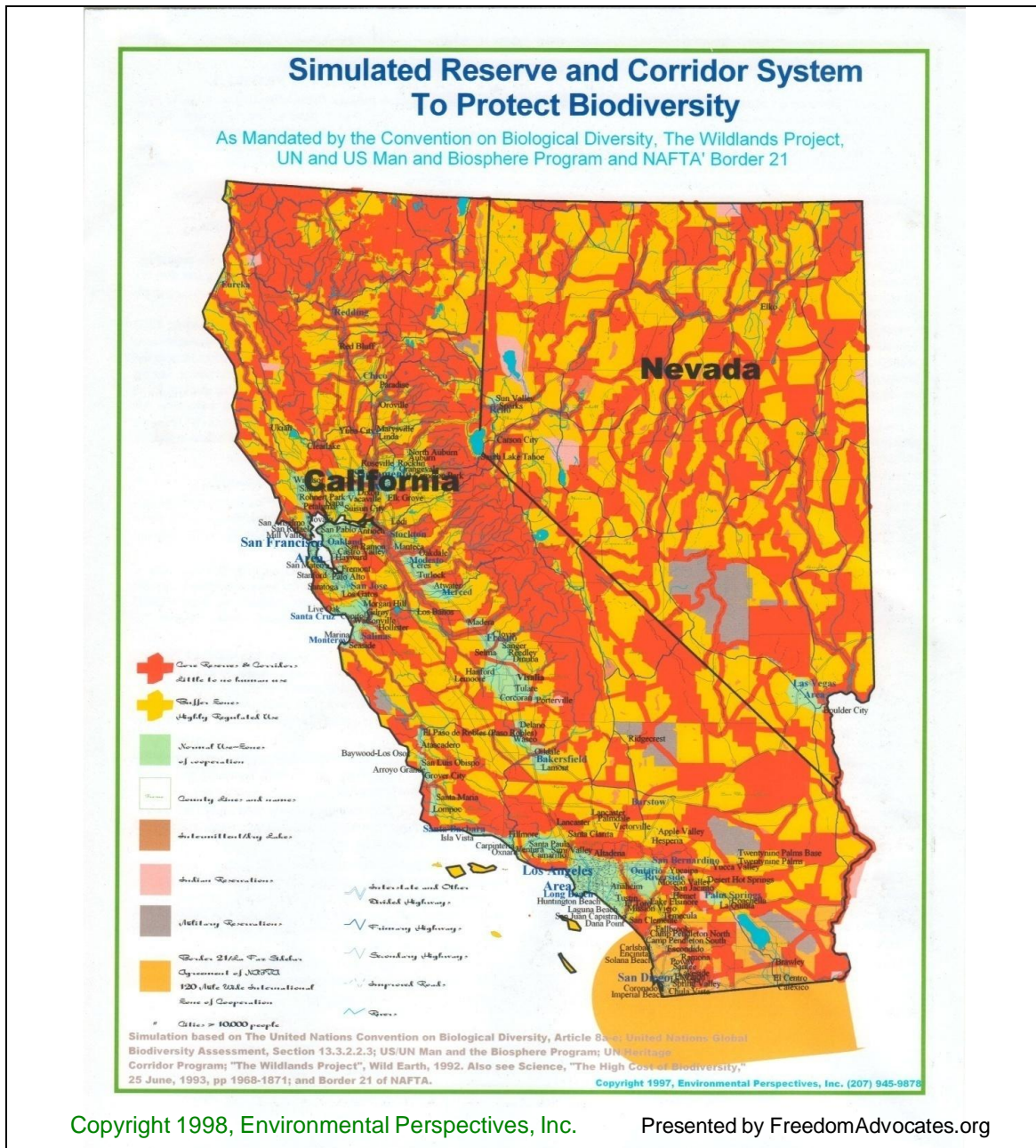

The Wildlands Network, in operation here in California, is helping to create and implement policies and legislation that promote massive land grabs.



The land policy of the United Nations was first officially articulated at the United Nations Conference on Human Settlement in Vancouver, Canada in 1976. This

quote is from the Preamble from the U.N. Policy on Land:

“Land... cannot be treated as an ordinary asset, controlled by individuals and subject to the pressures and inefficiencies of the market. Private land ownership is also a principle instrument of accumulation and concentration of wealth and therefore contributes to *social injustice*; if unchecked, it may become a major obstacle in the planning and implementation of development schemes... Public control of land use is therefore indispensable...”

Conservation easements are also promoted to aid in the fulfillment of the Wildlands objective. Stay away from conservation easements.

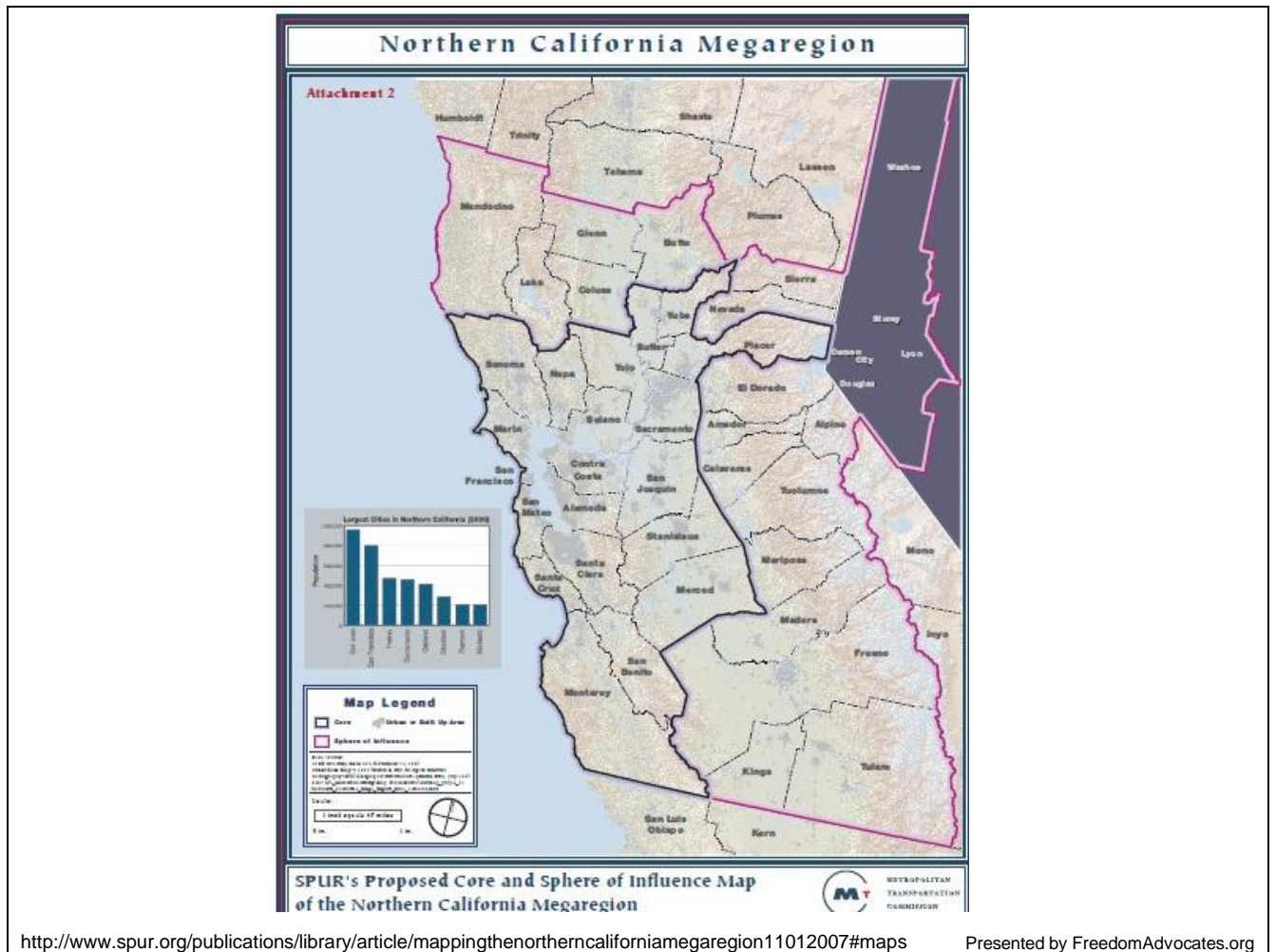
The Northern California Megaregion is designed to be comprised of Smart Growth built along transportation corridors. These corridors will be multi-modals for trucks, trains and passengers.

“San Francisco + Sacramento = *SanFramento*” – a Megaregion encompassing the Capital Region and the Bay Area. This Megaregion is divided into the Core and the Sphere of Influence.



[Called “Transit oriented communities”]

You can see from this map that Amador County lies within the “Sphere of Influence” of the Northern California Megaregion.



The Sphere of Influence will be highly regulated.
Human use will be massively regulated and controlled.

One of the ways the Sphere of Influence will be used is under the guise of Historic Preservation designed to advance the “common good”.






That was a lot to absorb. Let's recap just so you can absorb it better:
